The Connecting Families Early Help Conference 2023

The Connecting Families Team hosted the second Early Help Conference on 10th July 2023, following a break due to Covid. This year's theme was Children and Young Peoples' Voice and Participation / Feedback. The event was funded by the Reducing Parental Conflict fund, so this topic formed an essential part of the day, reminding us all to listen to children and young people who are struggling with unhealthy relationships, and how their parents / carers relationships effect them and what signs to look out for. Last



year we developed a toolkit to support everyone when working with those experiencing conflict in the home, and the link to access this is here

The day was very well received by all those who attended, some 50 plus practitioners from a wide range of agencies, from the voluntary sector to teachers, health visitors, early years and children services staff. Some feedback from participants included:

We would particularly like to thank the team from Southside and a youth work volunteer, who spoke about their personal experiences. I think they made us all think about how we should be **more caring and provide a consistent joined up approach** when working with families. The voice of child and young person lies at the heart of everything we do. It is important for those who use our services that this is the case; that they should have the space to express themselves, feel actively involved, listened to and able to influence the decisions that affect them and must lie firmly alongside that aspiration. We also need to hear from parents, carers and the wider family, as well. We are developing a **participation toolkit**, I hope that this will help you, the link can be found <u>here</u>

In B&NES Council we promote participation and therefore we hope that you find this a helpful guide to ensure you are working with children and young people from the outset in a way that not only improves their lives, but importantly that you support them to make decisions and that you have children and young people at the heart of the consultation, planning, delivery and feedback.

Connecting Families Summer Events

Connecting Families are kicking off the Summer with a number of special events to support our families.

- * 24th—26th July: Working in partnership with The Wheels Project at Brislington, we are running a Pre CBT course for new moped riders for four young people age 16 years and older. All the young people have previously attended a karting course with Connecting Families, and this course aims to engage and prepare new moped riders for safe responsible riding and to equip them with the basic skills required to maintain their moped safely,
- 9th August: A Katakanu (kayaks that seat up to 6 people), Games and Picnic event is being held at The Boathouse and a local park in Bath. This is open to existing CFT families or those recently closed.
- * 23rd August: A Riverside Family Fun Day is planned using Riverside Youth Hub in the morning, using the open space of Kensington Meadows in Bath in the afternoon. This is funded by Bathscape and the activity is open to existing CFT families or those recently closed.







These events have been very popular in the past ... last year all the families scored the Riverside Family Fun Day as "10 out of 10" for being a brilliant day, and some of the families have attended multiple times, which shows how much they enjoy these activities.

Connecting Families Talking Teens course

Talking Teens

The Connecting Families team have just finished a bespoke young persons' group (Talking Teens), which runs alongside a course



which supports their parents, and a group for children under 11 where they make crafts and play sports. These sessions, based at Southside Youth and Community Centre run every Thursday evening for 2 hours from 6.00—8.00 pm (22nd June — 20th July). We are also holding another Talking Teens course based at Radstock Children's Centre which will run every Thursday evening from 21st September—19th October 2023.



The sessions provide a safe space for the young people participating, to share and explore some of the issues they have been experiencing in their relationships with their parents/carers. During group discussions, the Keyworkers help the young people think of positive strategies that they can use to improve their relationships in the future. The parenting course, which runs alongside the Talking Teens group sessions, discusses being the parent of a teenager and provides help with communicating, problem solving and handling difficult issues.

The most significant barrier to the success of the Talking Teens group sessions was the apprehension that some young people had around where they would be going, what they would be doing and who would be there. Through talking with the Young People on the final session, it was apparent that having those initial conversations, made them fully aware of how the sessions would be delivered, and they were reassured that they would have a familiar person to talk to when they first arrived.

"Course providers were brilliant - never felt judged. They were obviously eager to help, all in all the course was brilliant. Every parent should do this - I only wish it went on longer!" "I'm so glad Jamie referred us to this course. The facilitators were friendly, non-judgemental and engaged us with a lot of content. My biggest thanks to Joan, Matty, Jamie and all the team that did activities with the kids too. What would we do without Connecting Families?!"

This was an essential day to help with team building, communication and enable us all to reconnect as a new team.






Jamie Flukes Keyworker
